

ABOUT US

Southern Counties Baptist Association (SCBA) are a family of 145 Baptist Churches, a variety of Pioneering Projects and chaplains; covering throughout Berkshire, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Hampshire, Oxfordshire and Wiltshire. The association includes Banbury in the north and Weymouth in the south, but also extends to Guernsey in the Channel Islands and the Isle of Wight.

SCBA seeks to inspire, connect and resource its churches and their leaders by growing and forming healthy churches in relationship for God's mission.

SCBA aims to:

- Resource effective mission
- Enable lifelong discipleship

SCBA is one of 13 Regional Associations that, together with local churches, the specialists teams and colleges make up the Baptist Union of Great Britain.

ROLE OF TRUSTEES

Trustees are responsible for overseeing our Association life. They are the trustees of the Association. Churches are invited to nominate members to the trustee board each year, and names are taken to an election at our Annual General Meeting.

Trustees serve for a term of three years and are then eligible for re-election; they are only allowed to serve two consecutive terms.

The Trustee Board can have up to 12 members (four of who are lay members).

We meet six times a year with an awayday in May. All travel expenses are covered by the SCBA.

Although our faith informs the decisions of the trustees we also recognise the benefit of having a trustee board that contains experience in:

- Human Resources
- Financial Planning
- Mission
- Digital Media
- Safeguarding

The Trustee body has several working groups which have delegated oversight of certain areas these are:
