The World Wildlife Fund's 'Living Planet' report shows that average wildlife populations have fallen by 73% in the past 50 years. That is a huge fall.

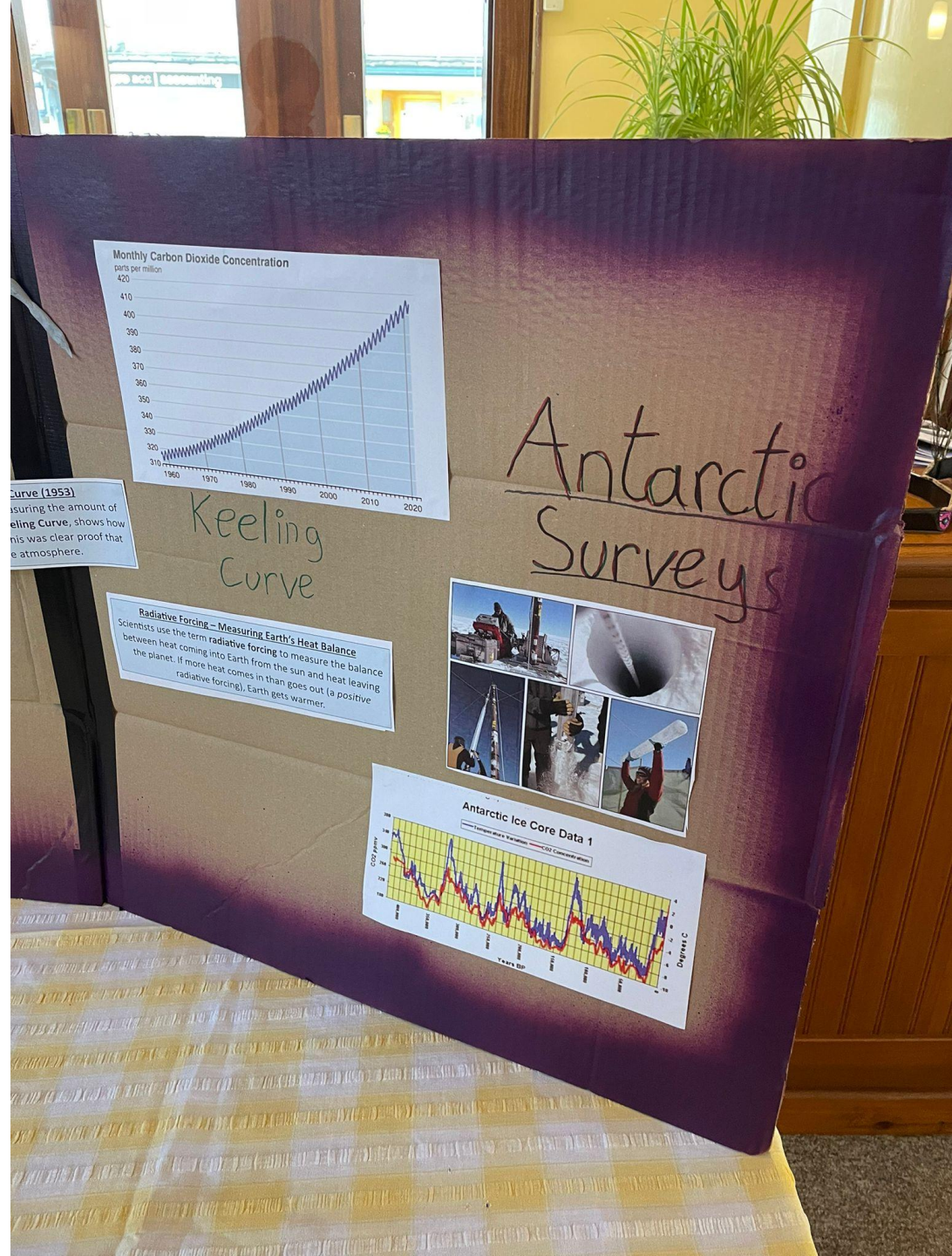
Scientists say that things are getting worse, not better. As temperatures rise, more and more species are threatened with extinction.
